- Project HIRE, an award-winning supported employment and transition program;
- **Planning For Adult Life**, assists young adults 14-21 and their families plan for life after school;
- **NJ Self-Advocacy Project,** assists individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities in becoming involved in self-advocacy as a means of supporting positive change on both a personal and legislative level;
- **Mainstreaming Medical Care,** helping families navigate the healthcare system, while training health care professionals about the health needs of people with developmental disabilities;
- **Criminal Justice Advocacy Program,** helping the courts and corrections systems work more effectively with people with developmental disabilities;
- **The Family Institute,** dedicated to providing timely information, advocacy, support and training to family members that have a loved one with an intellectual and developmental disability;
- **Camp Jaycee**, provides a unique overnight summer camp experience for children and adults with developmental disabilities.
