
Levels of Government






On the U.S. map above, mark where Washington D.C. is located.

- one representative per congressional district; As of 2010, New Jersey was divided into 13 congressional districts.






On the U.S. map above, mark where New Jersey is located.

- One Senator and two General Assembly members per legislative district; New Jersey is divided into 40 legislative districts.


