

On **Tuesday, November 3rd**, voters will choose: the U.S. President, all members of New Jersey's House of Representatives, 1 U.S. Senate seat, and other local representatives.

To prevent the spread of COVID-19, most voters in New Jersey's General Election will vote by mail. This resource provides step-by-step information to help you vote in the 2020 General Election by mail or at the polls.

### Step 1: Make sure you are registered to vote.

You must register to be able to vote. Most people only need to register one time. If you have voted in a government election in New Jersey before, you are most likely registered to vote.

Not sure if you're registered to vote? You can enter your name and date of birth in <u>New Jersey's Division</u> of <u>Elections Voter Search</u> online to find out.

*Not registered*? Complete the <u>Voter Registration Application</u> on the New Jersey Division of Elections website. You can register online or print and mail your voter registration application to your county's Commissioner of Registration by **Tuesday**, **October 13th**.

## Step 2: Learn about the candidates.

## Step 3: Make a plan to vote.

It's important to have a plan for how you will cast your vote. You can vote by mail or in-person at your assigned polling place.

New Jersey has made it easier than ever to vote-by-mail. All active registered voters will automatically get a Vote-By-Mail ballot for this election. Your County Clerk will send Vote-By-Mail ballots to voters by **October 6th**. If you register between October 6th and October 13th and want to vote by mail, you can request a Vote-By-Mail Ballot on your registration form. Voters with disabilities can request an Accessible Electronic Ballot from their County Clerk.

It is still possible to vote in-person. In-person voters will complete a provisional paper ballot. Voters with disabilities can vote in-person using an accessible machine. Fewer polling places will be open.



## Step 4: Cast your vote.

There are many options for submitting your Vote-By-Mail Ballot.



**Return it through the U.S. Postal Service with no stamp needed.** Your ballot must be postmarked by 8 p.m. on November 3rd and received by November 10th at 8 p.m. The U.S. Postal Service recommends mailing your ballot **at least** 7 days before Election Day.



**Return it to a secure drop box** in your area by 8 p.m. on November 3rd. Contact your county's Board of Elections for a list of drop box locations: <u>https://www.nj.gov/state/elections/county-eo.shtml</u>



Return it to your County Board of Elections in-person or have a bearer deliver your sealed ballot. The bearer must complete the Bearer section on your return envelope and show identification when they drop it off.

#### ACCESSIBLE VOTE-BY-MAIL BALLOTS

You can contact your County Clerk to request an accessible electronic Vote-By-Mail ballot. Accessible ballots can be completed on a computer, phone, or tablet. You must print the completed ballot and return it in the envelope you received with the regular Vote-By-Mail ballot.



Return your ballot to your assigned polling location on Election Day.

You can vote in-person on November 3rd from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. using a provisional paper ballot or an accessible voting machine. Voters must maintain a safe distance from each other and from poll workers at all times. You can look up your assigned polling place on the New Jersey Division on Elections website: <u>https://voter.svrs.nj.gov/polling-place-search</u>

If you requested a Vote-By-Mail ballot, but you did not return it, you may vote in-person on Election Day using a provisional ballot.

# Step 5: Track your ballot.

You can set up an account to find out when your County Clerk receives your Vote-By-Mail Ballot on the New Jersey Division of Elections website: <u>https://voter.svrs.nj.gov/auth/sign-up</u> DID YOU KNOW? You can only vote once in any election.
