



Understanding the Division of Developmental Disabilities Supports Program: A Guide for Caregivers

The New Jersey Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD), serve adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (I/DD) 21 years of age and over.

What is the Supports Program?

The Supports Program is a program for individuals 21 and older with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This program provides individuals living with their families or in other unlicensed settings, supports and services through the New Jersey Division of Developmental Disabilities (DDD).

What is a Support Coordination Agency?

A support coordination agency is a DDD funded service that assists individuals in gaining access to programs and state services.

What is a Support Coordinator?

Support Coordinators play an important role in the lives of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. They are professionals that help identify the supports an individual needs, help the individual plan for the life he/she wants, and connect the individual to services that will help him/her achieve a quality life in the community.

The Support Coordinator is responsible for developing and maintaining the individualized service plan (ISP) with the individual, the individual's family, and other team members designated by the individual.
