Key Partners:

Mobile Response and Stabilization (MRSS)

This service offers an urgent response to an individual and their family in crisis. This service is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by calling PerfomCare at 877-652-7624. MRSS helps with: coordination of supports and services, linkage and connection, family support, DD eligibility and documentation.

<u>Care Management Organization (CMO)</u> www.nj.gov/dcf/families/csc/care CMOs are county-based agencies that provide care coordination and care planning for children, youth and their families with moderate and complex needs. <u>CMOs are responsible for facilitating access to a full range of services and supports.</u>

Family Support Organizations (FSO)

FSO's are county-based organizations that provide direct family-to-family peer support, education, advocacy and other services to family members of children with emotional and behavioral problems, intellectual and developmental disabilities and substance abuse problems.

<u>Developmental Disability Services - Depending on your child's</u> unique needs, services and supports may include:

Family Support Services (FSS) - bit.ly/performcarefamilysupport

FSS helps to maintain and enhance the quality of life of a child with an intellectual and developmental disability and their family. These services can include: Educational Advocacy, Assistive Technology, Respite Care, and Home & Vehicle Modifications

Intensive In- home (IIH) - bit.ly/youthandfamilyguide (page 13)

For this service an <u>individual must be</u>: DD eligible (<u>bit.ly/csoceligibility</u>) and/or enrolled in CMO or MRSS Services. IIH Services require caregiver and/or family commitment, involvement and participation.

PerformCare will work the CMO to identify the least restrictive type of treatment setting to best meet your child's needs. <u>Treatment settings can include</u>: special skills home, group homes, specialty home, psychiatric community home, and intensive psychiatric community home.
