What is DVRS	The New Jersey Division of Vocational Rehabilitation Services (DVRS) provides services that enable individuals with disabilities to find jobs or keep their existing jobs. If you or a loved one has a disability that is preventing employment, or is endangering present employment, you can submit a referral for services (see "Timeline" below for referral links).			
Who is Eligible	Any individual with a physical or mental impairment that wants to be employed at a competitive wage may qualify for individual or vocational rehabilitation services.			
What Services Does DVRS Offer People with Developmental Disabilities?	The consumer and DVRS counselor will work together to develop an Individualized Plan for Employment (IPE). The plan may include: Vocational Counseling & Guidance, Job Placement Services, Job Seeking Skills, Supported Employment, Time Limited Placement and Coaching, Job Accommodations, Skills Training, *College Training, Physical and/or Emotional Restoration (Equipment or therapies which improve physical or cognitive functioning so that a person is able to work), Mobility Equipment, <i>Driver Training</i> , or Vehicle and/or Home Modification.
