FIVE FAST FACTS FOR FRIDAY Garden State Pathways Program



- The Garden State Pathways Program is a post-secondary, transitional program sponsored by Camden County College in Blackwood, New Jersey and designed for students with intellectual/cognitive disabilities. The program serves students eighteen years of age or older who are eligible for or received IDEA funding and are interested in learning a work-related skill, as well as enhancing their independence with life skills
- Students take classes in socialization, financial literacy, life skills and their personal interest. Students are required to spend time developing their skills in a career interest that will enhance their employability. After completing all required courses and work experiences in this two-year program, students receive a certificate of Postsecondary Studies (CPS) from Camden County College.
- Students are encouraged to integrate into College life through various on-campus, social activities such as the Spring Fling, Welcome Back BBQ, various clubs as well as educational lectures outside of the typical classroom.
- How to Apply: GSP students should complete the online College application with the code SPVO. Once the College application is received, an application for the Garden State Pathways certificate will be sent to the applicant.
