What is the Children's System of Care (CSOC)? The Children's System of Care, serves individuals with emotional and behavioral health care challenges and their amilies; and individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families. CSOC provides these services based on the needs of the individual and family in a amily-centered, community-based environment.		 Individuals between the ages of 5 and 21, and live in NJ. The parent or child must be a US citizen or permanent resident. You only need to provide the proof for the parent, or the child you are applying for, not both. To access services through CSOC call 1-877-652-7624 or TTY at 1-866-896-6975 . This is the single point of entry into the Children's System of Care. This number connects you to PerformCare, the Contracted System Administrator (CSA) for the Children's System of Care. PerformCare can be reached 24/7, 365 days a year.	The parent/guardian must make the call to PerformCare to ask for assistance. Who can help the parent/ guardian make that call: • teachers or child study team • social workers or clinicians • medical personnel • pastors • others involved with the child or family Individuals can assist the parent/guardian through a conference call, but the parent/ guardian must be willing to speak to the Care Coordinator.
